PRESIDENTIAL EQUITY FUND

Shortly after his arrival at Marist in 2021, President Kevin C. Weinman and his wife, Beth, announced a very generous pledge in the amount of \$250,000 to establish the Presidential Fund for Equity in the Marist Experience as an inspirational demonstration of their support. This important fund helps to remove financial barriers for talented students so they can pursue high-impact experiences that may be unattainable to some students, such as unpaid internships, attachment courses with a travel component, and tutoring services.

More than 60 donors have joined Kevin and Beth in supporting this unique fund including every member of the College's Board of Trustees. Nearly \$1 million has been raised to date, including \$840,000 in term support and \$150,000 in endowed funds. This report illustrates the total expenditures from the fund as of September 30, 2023, broken down by activity. As of September 30, 2023, 189 students have applied for funding and 125 students have received awards. The impact of this special fund is immeasurable.






Jaden Woodard-Teneus '24
