FACULTY RESOURCES

The CORE/Liberal Studies Committee is an appointed standing committee having a direct relationship to the Academic Affairs Committee in reporting of matters considered by the CORE/Liberal Studies Committee, and in questions relation to CORE/Liberal Studies policy.

FUNCTIONS

The CORE/Liberal Studies Committee is empowered:

- 1) To advance the implementation and development of the CORE/Liberal Studies program;
- 2) To exercise primary curricular jurisdiction over the Foundation and Capping Experience courses, and new courses not currently identified as fitting the distribution and extension area.
- 3) To review alternative proposals for CORE/Liberal Studies and to make recommendations to the Academic Affairs Committee.
- 4) To monitor and to encourage Faculty attention to global issues, to the development of oral communication skills and to the value issues in those courses that students normally use to satisfy CORE/Liberal Studies requirements.
- 5) To promote workshops, institutes, lectures and faculty development programs to further serious examination of the areas mentioned in function #4.

COMPOSITION OF THE CORE/LIBERAL STUDIES COMMITTEE

- 1) The CORE/Liberal Studies Committee is composed of the CORE/Liberal Studies Director, and Faculty members from the remaining Schools, appointed by the Faculty Affairs Committee in conjunction with the Chair of the Academic Affairs Committee, following recommendations of candidates by the Director and the Academic Affairs Committee. The Faculty members are selected from among vested Faculty who serve the College primarily as teachers and who have been employed as teachers at Marist College for at least one full school year.
- 2) The Director of College Writing.
- 3) The Dean of the School of Liberal Arts is an *ex-officio* member.
- 4) One student representative with voting rights is appointed by the President of the Student Government Association, with approval from the Senate, from among the full-time students at Marist College.
- 5) The Director of CORE/Liberal Studies shall serve as Chair.

TERMS OF OFFICE

Faculty committee members are normally appointed for a regular term of three years and serve in staggered terms.

The Director of CORE/Liberal Studies will be a Faculty member appointed for a three year renewable term by the Academic Vice President/Dean of Faculty after consultation with the Academic Affairs Committee.
