Grants for Advanced Study

Marist College students have experienced increasing success in their applications for nationally competitive scholarships

Marist has been recognized by the Institute of International Education as a top producer of Fulbright Grant recipients

Over the past eleven years, twenty Marist students have received Fulbright U.S. Student Program Grants to spend nine to eleven months abroad following graduation, either pursuing research or teaching English in another country. For the third consecutive year, Marist was recognized as a "Fulbright U.S. Student Program Top Producer" by the Institute of International Education. This recognition singles out U.S. institutions of higher education which have produced the greatest number of Fulbright Student Grant recipients in a given competition cycle. The distinction is published annually in *The Chronicle of Higher Education*.

Distinguished awards help to promote study of Science, Teaching, Study Abroad

In the last decade, four Marist students have been named Barry M. Goldwater Scholars for their undergraduate promise in scientific research; two students have received the National Science Foundation (NSF) Graduate

Research Fellowship for doctoral study in the sciences; and one student was awarded the James Madison Memorial Fellowship supporting graduate studies for future secondary school teachers of U.S. History or government, and the sole recipient from New York State. Additionally, ten Marist students have received the Benjamin Gilman Scholarship for funding undergraduate studies abroad and a Marist sophomore was awarded the highly competitive U.S./U.K. Fulbright Summer Institute Grant to participate in a four-week summer intensive program at the University of Bristol.

Trend continues: four Marist finalists are up for this year's Fulbright Award, three for Goldwater Scholarship

Academic scholarship continues to take center stage at Marist, with four students advancing to finalist status in this year's Fulbright competition. In addition, three Science majors are Marist nominees for the Goldwater Scholarship.
