

■ Distribution

A maximum of two foreign-language courses at the intermediate or advanced level may substitute for the second course in MATH, NATURAL SCIENCE, HISTORY, or LITERATURE. 3 hours of a foreign culture course may substitute for the second course in either HISTORY or LITERATURE. Due to NYS Education requirements Psychology Special Education majors may only substitute for their second LITERATURE requirement. PHILOSOPHY OR RELIGIOUS STUDIES REQUIREMENT: Any course in Philosophy or Religious Studies EXCEPT PHIL101L, PHIL103L, or PHIL300L

If a course does not work to cover a requirement it will be listed under the electives, or possibly as Not Counted (either because it was entered incorrectly – L versus and N was used – or the course does not exist).
