

Born and raised in Detroit, Michigan.

Began collecting FDCs as young boy in 1952.

In 1965, after finishing graduate school, moved to Pok, NY to work for IBM's Technology Division - retired in 2002.

My FDC collecting waned during working years – work, life intervened.

<u>Re-awakened by CLS (4-week) course</u> taken in (Spring) 2018 on stamp collecting.

Course taught by Allen Fink, avid stamp collector AND professional (APS*) appraiser. * => American Philatelic Society

THANKS Allen for re-awakening a hidden passion – after many years!

My collecting approach changed - from personally preparing and sending away for FDCs → to buying them from stamp dealers. HOWEVER, enjoyment and passion for hobby still persists.

 Although overall value of my collection (> 600 FDCs) not significant in monetary terms → joy, excitement, and knowledge accrued in collecting will be described, amplified.
 N O T E - Oct 1 marked start of National Stamp Collecting Month. Annual celebration inaugurated October 1, 1981, 40 years ago.


STAMPS ARE PIECES OF ART (MINATURE MASTERPIECES) – ESSENTIAL COMPONENT OF STAMP DESIGN.



So What is a First Day Cover (FDC)?



THREE BASIC ELEMENTS



Envelope bearing stamp which is cancelled on day stamp is initially placed on sale by postal authorities.

<= FDC with Snowy Egret <u>stamp</u> (A) affixed.

Shown with New York, NY, First Day of Issue cancel (B)

Cachet (C), pronounced *ka-shay*, which compliments or tells us something about stamp.

What is a First Day Cover – FDC – Why Unique?

A U.S. First Day Cover, or FDC, is an envelope or post card bearing stamp cancelled on date stamp was first available for postal use.


- In US, stamps traditionally placed on sale at site designated as official First Day post office, - usually ceremony dedicating new stamp. Stamp or stamps then go on general nationwide sale following day.
- FDC collecting first became popular in 1920s, when U.S. Post Office began to more frequently issue commemorative stamps. In 1920s and early 1930s First Day Covers were postmarked with everyday working postmarks.

First official FIRST DAY postmark with the familiar words "First Day of Issue" between bars - used for Ordinance of 1787 commemorative stamp in 1937.

> In late 1950s to early 1960s, often small illustration included in the postmark below the city name and date. In more recent years, first day postmarks have usually been unique graphics related to the stamp's subject, often in color.

GREAT RESOURCE - <u>American First Day Cover Society</u>, non-profit organization devoted to advancement and collecting of first day covers.

FDC - Ordinance of 1787 Sesquicentennial (150th Anniv.) Issue



First official first day postmark with familiar words "FIRST DAY OF ISSUE" between bars → used for Ordinance of 1787 commemorative in June 1937.


Ordinance of 1787 Sesquicentennial (150th Anniversary) Issue


Territory consisted of lands north of Ohio River and east of Mississippi River — lands comprising states of Ohio, Michigan, Indiana, Illinois, Wisconsin, and part of Minnesota.

What is a <u>Cacheted</u> FDC?



"Typical" first day cover includes pictorial cachet (A) + special **"FIRST DAY OF ISSUE**" (FDol) postmark (B) from issuing city (C) **Cleveland**, Ohio on March 22, 1958 Unfortunately, there has been dramatic shift in value of first-day covers. **Over years, collectors**

have made it clear that they prefer first-day covers <u>with cachets</u> and NO address.


Once, U.S. stamp had <mark>4 official first day ceremonies on 3 different dates!</mark>

Statehood issue of 1939 (US #858) commemorated 50th anniversary of 4 states, and was issued on:

- November 2 in Bismarck, North Dakota, and Pierre, South Dakota,
- □ November 8 in Helena, Montana,
 - and November 11 in Olympia, Washington.

All four of these cities and dates considered "official first day" of this stamp.


Honored 50th anniversary of addition of four states.

November 1889, four states were admitted to Union: North Dakota & South Dakota -**November 2nd, 1889,** Montana - November 8th, 1889, Washington - November 11th, 1889. As seen - 3 of 4 states border Canada. **U.S./Canadian border curves at** that point. **Roosevelt** – always stickler for detail - correctly sketched the design showing that curve. **Design made states resemble** laundry hanging on wash line.


Lead to stamp's nickname of "clothesline stamp."





Earl Schill's coin shop (John R St in downtown Detroit) closed on October 31, 1988. He operated as stamp & coin dealer since late 1920's - had shop in Detroit since early 1940's. Died in 1993.



The Battle of Brooklyn (also known as Battle of Long Island) marked first fighting between Continental and British armies of the Revolutionary War.

Largest battle of the war.

British General William Howe commanded an army of 32,000 backed by powerful British fleet.

August 1776, British force attacked General George Washington and his army of 20,000.


Washington's troops lacked military training of British soldiers, and General had no navy.

It's estimated Americans suffered about 2,000 casualties, while British losses were less than 400.



Design of U.S. #1073 comes from painting by Benjamin West, called, "Franklin Taking Lightning from the Sky."

West and Franklin were close friends

Stamp issued on 250th anniv. of Franklin's birth

Franklin (1706-90) was American statesman, writer, scientist, and inventor born in Boston, Massachusetts.

Only person to sign all 4 key documents in US history -Declaration of Independence, Treaty of Alliance with France,

Treaty of Peace with Great Britain, and US Constitution

Franklin appointed first U.S. Postmaster General in 1775

Franklin Appointed First U.S. Postmaster General In 1775

WHAT HAS FRANKLIN WROUGHT? ASSESSING USPS TODAY (Size and Scope)

Postal Service serves 161.4 million addresses in country – covering every state, city and town. 429.9M mail pieces daily – more than any other post in world. Everyone living in U.S. and its territories has access to postal products and services and pays same for First-Class Mail postage stamp regardless of location.

Postal Service sends 3.3M pounds of international, military and diplomatic mail and packages weekly, using 64 international airlines, comprised of 11 US Flag Carriers and their affiliates.

There are 31,330 Postal Service-managed retail offices (doesn't include contract offices).



1956 3¢ Nassau Hall, Princeton University – 200th Anniversary FDC



Nassau Hall - oldest building on campus of Princeton University, founded in 1746. Hall completed in 1756. During American Revolutionary War, building occupied by both British and Colonial forces. From July to October 1783, the Hall hosted U.S. government -Congress of Confederation met on 2nd floor.

Princeton University notes received news of definitive treaty of peace with Great Britain and welcomed first foreign minister – from Netherlands – accredited to United States."

General George Washington captured Nassau Hall, bringing Battle of Princeton to successful conclusion for Colonial Army.

This victory marked major turning point in Revolutionary War.



July 24, 1701, French explorer Antoine de la Mothe Cadillac established fort on site of what would become City of Detroit.



MACKINAC BRIDGE FACTS

- Suspension bridge spanning Straits of Mackinac. Connects Upper and Lower Peninsulas of Michigan. US I-75
- Opened in 1957.
- 26,372-foot-long (4.995 mi)
- Known as "Big Mac" and "Mighty Mac")
- World's 24th-longest main span
- Longest suspension bridge between anchorages in the Western Hemisphere.
- Bridge connects city of St. Ignace, MI on north end with village of Mackinaw City, MI on south.
- Length of bridge's main span is 3,800 feet, which makes it third-longest suspension span in United States.
- 20th longest suspension span worldwide. Also one of world's longest bridges overall.









CARRY OUT DETAILED INVENTORY OF EVERY ITEM – USE SPREADSHEET

ESTIMATE EACH FDC VALUE – CATALOG / INTERNET (EBAY, ETC.) PRICE → NECESSARY FOR REPLACEMENT / INSURANCE; HOWEVER, FOR ACTUAL SALE - TAKE 50-60 PERCENT (RULE OF THUMB)

CONTACT REPUTABLE, LICENSED APPRAISER OR STAMP DEALER (POSSIBLE BUYER) TO CONDUCT FORMAL APPRAISAL

SERIOUS OR CASUAL COLLECTOR – DEALER UP FRONT QUESTION


