Composition in Painting- Emphasize the Focal Point and the Golden Rectangle.

As a "plein air" painter, amidst the bounty of the outdoors, how do I decide what to paint?

What caught my eye in a scene?

How do I direct my viewers to see what I want them to see?

Where do I want to place my "point of interest" or "focal point" first on my sketch and then on my canvas?

What is the Golden Rectangle?

How does that help me in planning my drawings and paintings?

Using my own sketches and finished watercolors, I will show how I design my pieces to draw a viewer into the picture and see what caught my eye in the first place.

I will pull examples from works from art history to illustrate my points.

Italian altarpieces, Hudson River School painting, Impressionist works, and even Abstract pieces will serve as examples of how to compose for the maximum effect.

What we love about art is there are no hard and fast "rules," and these points are only a starting point from which you should "find your own way" in design and composition.
