



State Support for Local Climate Action

Climate Smart Communities (CSC) is a New York State program that helps local governments take action to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and adapt to a changing climate. The program offers free technical assistance, grants, and rebates for electric vehicles.

Registered communities have made a commitment to act by passing the CSC pledge. Certified communities are the foremost leaders in the state; they have gone beyond the CSC pledge by completing and documenting a suite of actions that mitigate and adapt to climate change at the local level.

CSC: NYS Climate Smart Communities

- NYS program to assist local governments in reducing GHG emissions and adapting to the changing climate
- 360+ registered communities have pledged to act (town, city, village, county)
- Certification at bronze (85), silver (9), or gold level
- Based upon completion of prescribed actions in various areas of climate change mitigation (prevention) and adaptation (response planning)
- Certification positions communities for further grant funding

CSC, continued

- Began in 2009 as an interagency initiative of New York State
- Jointly sponsored by
 - Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) (administrator)
 - Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA)
 - Department of Public Service
 - Department of State
 - Department of Transportation
 - Department of Health
 - Power Authority



- To push forward on clean energy
- Administered by NYSERDA
- Resources, support, and funding for high-impact clean energy actions
- Certification and certain actions leading to grants

- Energy code enforcement training for municipal personnel
- Clean energy financing for commercially owned buildings
- Clean energy upgrades
- Municipal clean heating/cooling demo site
- Municipal operations on 100% renewables


CEC High Impact Actions, continued


CAC: Conservation Advisory Comission

- Conservation Advisory Comission
- Established by NYS General Municipal Law
- Advisory to local governing, planning and zoning boards
- Focused on stewardship, development, management, and protection of local natural resources
- Natural Resource Inventories (NRI) Open Space Plans

CAB: Conservation Advisory Board

- Upon completion of Natural Resource Inventory and Open Space Plan, the local legislature may pass a resolution to designate the CAC as a CAB
- More formal involvement in review of land-use applications



The Pollinator Pathway


