## 1 Watch for Tax Fraud Scams

It is important to keep an eye on your email for any suspicious messages that ask for tax information. As tax season approaches, cybercriminals will try to send out phishing emails in an attempt to steal your personal information. These attackers often pretend to be someone you recognize, such as an employer or the IRS. ## 2 AI in Cyber Attacks

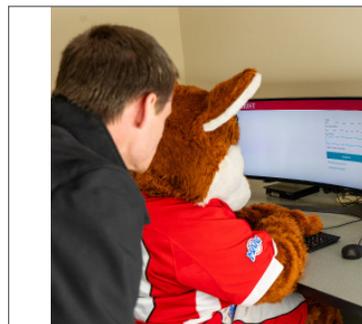
Artificial Intelligence (AI) is being used by attackers to make scams smarter and harder to spot. For example, AI can generate convincing fake messages or mimic someone's writing style. AI is also used for creating deepfakes which are meant to impersonate someone and can be damaging to one's reputation. Attackers are also using AI to conduct research for them, meaning attackers can string together attacks easily. Ensure to carefully review everything.

## 3 Ransomware Evolution

Among the 2025 trends, ransomware continues to be a top threat. Ransomware is where attackers lock your files and demand payment, and attackers are becoming more aggressive with it. Not only will they encrypt your files, but they will take your data and leak sensitive information. Ensure to regularly backup your files and store them in a different location for easier recovery.
