

Requirements

General Membership: \$25 every year

Must declare a major/concentration in either Finance or Accounting.

National Membership: One-time fee of \$85, Official Induction takes place in the Spring Semester.

National Members must maintain at least a 3.40 cumulative grade average on the most recently completed 30 semester hours

Must be currently enrolled or have taken BUS 320 (Financial Management) or ACCT 301 (Intermediate Accounting I)

NYC Event

Annually, Beta Alpha Psi members have the opportunity to join our New York City Networking Event, where students connect with Marist alumni and industry professionals. Transportation is provided via bus, and food is included at the event. Please note that spots are limited, so early sign-up is encouraged.

Beta Buddies Program

The Beta Buddies Program is a peer mentorship initiative designed to help new members make the most of their experience in Beta Alpha Psi and at Marist College. Through the program, upperclassmen members are paired with underclassmen to provide guidance, advice, and support both academically and professionally. Beta Buddies serve as a valuable resource for underclassmen navigating accelerated and rigorous recruiting timelines for finance and accounting students, coursework, and campus involvement, while upperclassmen gain leadership experience by mentoring the next generation of business professionals.

Earn Priority Points through Clubs and Activities

To earn one (1) point: Members must attend a minimum of 50% of club/organization meetings for the semester and 50% of club/organization activities.

To earn two (2) points: Members must attend a minimum of 50% of club/organization meetings for the semester and 75% of club/organization activities PLUS the community service event.

To earn three (3) points (Executive Board only): Officers must attend 50% of club meetings for the semester and 100% of club activities including community service. If executive board members do not complete all of the requirements to earn three points, they will be eligible to receive up to two points based on the above criteria.
