Diversity, Equity & Inclusion

This week, the Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Board held its weekly meeting and continued advancing initiatives for the year. These include developing belonging spaces for first-generation students, creating opportunities for students and professors to share their personal experiences around DEI in the classroom, and engaging in conversations around the Cultural Dinner Dance. On Monday, Itati Serrano met with Dr. Antonio to discuss bringing the Intercultural Development Inventory (IDI) to SGA, finding that most students are interested in participating. They also discussed the idea of creating a town hall with Dr. Antonio and President Weinman. Work is underway to explore collaboration with Safety and Security on these initiatives. On Tuesday, Itati met with Alexandra Rossi from the DEI Office to discuss messaging for the campus climate survey. She will serve on the communications committee for this initiative. Later that day, Itati also met with Andrea Connor to discuss how DEI is involved in student life, and Andrea expressed enthusiasm for future collaboration. On Wednesday, Itati and her deputy, Marcus Francis, met with Rebecca Sellmeyer to discuss the Cultural Dinner Dance budget and event logistics. In preparation for Thursday's Diversity Council meeting, Itati and five other members tabled in front of the library from 2-4 p.m., gathering student input on DEI. She is currently compiling the feedback into a shared Google document. That same day, the DEI Board, the Office of DEI, Gourmet,

and the Hispanic/Latina Club hosted an event to welcome the start of Hispanic Heritage Month. The lively and well-attended event brought students together to share a meal and music that reminded them of home. Students expressed how meaningful it was to feel that sense of belonging. Finally, on Friday, Itati met with Robert Lynch and Julie Byron to explore the possibility of holding the Cultural Dinner Dance at Payne Mansion. From this meeting, Itati was tasked with preparing a budget proposal, with Bob offering his support in the process.
