# **Diversity, Equity & Inclusion**

This week, the Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Board held its weekly meeting to discuss the initiatives its members are working on. One initiative is the Belong Spaces, which will first serve first-generation students and then extend to the LGBTQ+ student community. The president of Fox Pride has agreed to support the event and will be joining us on the night of. Another initiative, Dear Marist, Love the World, is connected to Narrative 4 and dialogue, where students can share their personal stories, specifically their relationship with Marist, which will then be shared with others. The Board is also continuing work on the Cultural Dinner Dance, focusing on finalizing a theme. Two board members volunteered to serve as digital creators for the event flyers. To provide them with finalized themes, Itati held an Affinity Council meeting on Friday. Many members from affinity clubs were present, including Hillel Club, BSU, ASA, MISA, IAS, HLC, and Greek-American. They finalized four themes, which will be shared in a survey with students via a Google Form posted on Instagram on Monday, September 29. The form will close on October 1, and the top choice by the student body will become this year's dinner dance theme. This timeline allows the digital creators to design flyers and ensures over a month of ticket sales. Itati Serrano also tasked the Affinity Council with beginning research on dishes to be featured at the dance, an important first step as venue and catering logistics are still being worked out.

Additionally, Itati met with Robert Lynch from Student Activities to work on a preliminary budget for the dinner dance, which will be submitted as a proposal to Julie Byron for consideration of Payne Mansion as the venue. Finally, to support her board members in their initiatives, Itati assigned her deputies, Ananya Andrade and Marcus Francis, specific areas of focus. They will be checking in with their groups to ensure accountability and provide assistance, keeping service to the student community at the forefront of how the board operates. This process ensures that initiatives continue to move forward and that the semester's calendar of events remains on track for the rest of the year.
