# Updating Android devices

For Android devices, ensure they are updated to the latest versions.

Before updating to a new Android version, it is a good idea to do a full backup of your phone. There are many options to do this such as using Google Drive's backup feature.

# Backing up your Android device using Google Drive



#### Step 1: Select Accounts and backup Settings

• Open the Settings app and select > Accounts and backup.

#### Step 2: Select Google Drive Back up data


- Within the Accounts and backup settings select > Back up data.
- If prompted sign into your google account.
- You can then select what you would like to backup to Google Drive, this can include photos and videos, or other device data. This can be Contacts Call History, SMS messages, etc.

#### Step 3: Backup your data

- Hit confirm (you may need to give access to your photos) > Manage backup > Back up now.
- Enter your pin to start the backup process.




Step 1: Select the Settings app.





Step 2: Scroll down to About phone.



Step 3: Locate **System Updates** and then **Check for Updates**. If there is an update, you will see **Install System Software** or **Update to Download and Install the Latest Android Version**.

# How to update apps on Android devices

### Step 1: Located the Google Play Store app

• Open the Google Play store app > tap on the profile icon on the top right.

# Step 2: Update Manage app & device settings

Tap Manage apps & device > Under updates available tap see details.

# Step 3: Update your app

- Next to the app you want to update tap Update.
- To update all your apps at the same time, tap Update all.
