Why go abroad?

Marist Abroad promotes international engagement and academic, personal, and professional development through rigorous, reflective study abroad, overseas internships, and international campus programming.

At Marist over 50% of our undergraduates will study abroad during their time here and many will go more than once!

Where can I Study Abroad?

Marist Abroad offers dozens of programs on six continents. Please visit our website for a list of semester program offerings.

Academics

Classes: Students can take classes in their core, major or minor subject areas. They can also take electives, do internship or research while abroad for credit.

Credits: All courses come back for Marist credits. Prior to departure students work with their academic advisors and the department chairs to ensure courses return for degree requirements.

Graduation: With planning, students can graduate on time with an abroad experience.

Foreign Language: Most of our programs teach courses in English, even if English is not the predominate language of the country. Students can take language courses but they do not need to be fluent to apply.

Academic Accommodations: Many study abroad programs can accommodate a student's academic needs, as long as the student is able to provide documentation.

Physical & Non-Visible Disabilities: Study abroad opportunities are available to all students. By working with Marist Abroad you can find the program that works best for you.

When can I go?

Students can go abroad for the full academic year, fall or spring semester, or for a short term.

It is important to plan with your academic advisor academic advisor, since some majors have set aside specific time in their 4-year plans to study abroad.

Semester Abroad Costs

Study abroad students are billed directly by Marist. The Marist Abroad Program Fee is comparable to a semester at Marist. The program fee includes: tuition, housing, health insurance and orientation fees.

The Program Fee does not include: airfare, books/supplies, personal expenses and meals. Students are responsible for their own travel arrangements for semester programs.

Financial aid (loans, scholarships, grants, etc.) applies to study abroad semesters and there are additional scholarships students can apply for.

Faculty Led Short Term Programs

Marist Abroad has a number of short-term program options each year. These programs are taught by a Marist faculty member and have a travel component in the winter, spring or summer. Marist bills students the short term Program Fee during the semester of their program. Program Fee inclusions vary by short term program type.

Eligibility

Semester/Academic Year

- Sophomore, Junior or Senior
- GPA of 2.5 (higher for some programs)
- Good academic/disciplinary standing

Short Term

- Freshman, Sophomore, Junior or Senior
- GPA of 2.0 (higher for some programs)
- Good academic/disciplinary standing

Application deadlines

- Fall Semester/Academic Year: March 1
- Summer Session: April 1
- Spring Attachment/Winter Session: November 1
- Spring Semester: September 20
