

Campus Employment Information – International Students

International students may only work on campus during your first two semesters due to the conditions of your F-1 VISA. Jobs outside of Marist are prohibited by your VISA at this time, due to United States government regulations.

Jobs on campus are competitive. Most students will not get a job on campus. Do not plan on a campus job to help you pay your living expenses. If you secure a job you will be expected to attend all training and each shift you are scheduled to work. Students who do not fulfill their obligations may lose their positions. Be responsible and fulfill your work obligations to keep the job.

If you get an interview

Dress in business casual attire - no suits are needed but do not wear jeans or shorts. Go by yourself. Do not bring friends. All departments will require you to apply through Handshake.

Working CPT (Curricular practical training or Internship) during your education

Marist is actively working to acquire names of companies who may provide CPT and OPT opportunities for our students. More information about this will be available after the semester begins.

If you are doing an internship (CPT) you cannot also be working in campus employment, unless the total of both jobs is 20 hours or less. CPT is available starting in your second year, per government regulations.

If you are offered a job

- Get an offer letter from the hiring manager.
- Take the offer letter to International Student Services, Library room 337
- Work with ISS to secure a Social Security Number.
- Follow ISS instructions to make yourself eligible to start working.
