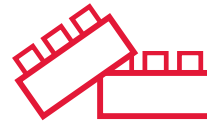

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- ▶ Graduate admissions application (available online)
- ▶ Official undergraduate/graduate transcripts from all institutions attended
- ▶ Minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA required
- ▶ Two letters of recommendation (one from a former professor, one from your cooperating teacher)
- ▶ Resumé
- ▶ Personal statement (about 750 words describing your background, experiences, goals, and how these relate to your work in education)

Qualified candidates will be asked to have an interview in person or by phone with the Program Director. The interview process may require a short written task.
