V. New Business

- o Andrea Conor Free Speech Policy Discussion
 - The Free Speech Policy was sent out on August 27th and it's also available in the student handbook on the Marist website.
 - This Policy upholds concepts regarding freedom of speech in the Marist Community
 - This policy is governing behavior but it wasn't implemented to limit students from free speech
 - A. Zarebczan asked Andrea if she had spoken to the Security faculty. Andrea responded by first, complementing the question, then answered by saying that she has been very impressed with Dan Gough. His military experience and his career decisions are built strongly around working in a college environment. Andrea views him as a very important piece of the campus. Together, they stood over past working hours to make sure that when students use their voices, they do so safely.

- P. Cama asked what are some ways to have SGA spread awareness of the new policy. Andrea responded by saying that she views her goals as advocating for the voice of the students. So spread the word about the existence of student speech. Sometimes students do use their voice to promote. So spreading the word intelligently is important for the viability of a strong student body.
- S. Speight asked if there was a violation of the policy and if there were "checks and balances". Andrea responds by saying that it all ties to the regular student conduct path. The rules of the school still stand unchanged through that new free speech policy. If you write a policy you should hold people to it.
- S. Speight asked if there was an update on the food pantry. Andrea said she recently discovered that there are multiple student leaders trying to help with all food insecurities on campus.
- The Red Fox Writing Club Charter
 - O. Dunn asked why the Red Fox Writing Club needs to be a club if they are so similar to the multiple writing clubs on campus. The club responded that it's a new space where the writing is not getting published. It's just a space to write freely with no judgment
 - S. Speight asked what a typical meeting looks like. They responded by stating it starts with introductions, then prompt writing activity, a group poem, and free options to share work made in the meeting.
 - K. Soryta asked about having faculty members attend the meetings. The club responded saying they haven't but that it's a great idea.
 - R. Torres asked if they talked with Red Inc. They answered that they hadn't talked with them but believed that Red Inc. is focused on arts and other types of expression.
 - O. Dunn motioned to move to an informal discussion. K. seconded the motion
