Course Description

This course examines the physical, intellectual, emotional, and social aspects in the development of children from conception through the early adolescent period.

Upon completion of this course students should be able to:

- 1. Students will be able to describe major developmental milestones for children from conception through middle childhood in the areas of physical, cognitive, emotional, and social development.
- 2. Students will be able to recognize, understand, and discuss major theories of child development.
- 3. Students will gain an ability to demonstrate knowledge of current research as it applies to child development.
- 4. Students will learn to identify and describe biological and environmental factors that influence children's development from conception through middle childhood across major domains.
- 5. Students will be able to demonstrate knowledge of the physical, cognitive, social, and emotional development of children, both typical and atypical, in major developmental stages.
- 6. Students will gain knowledge to examine and evaluate the importance of the early developmental years and the role of family in facilitating children's development.
- 7. Students will be able to explain the relationship between biology, maturation, environment, and culture in terms of their impact on typical and atypical growth, development, and learning.
- 8. Students will learn to identify the risk-factors for and the characteristics of potential developmental delays and disabilities.
- 9. Students will be able to summarize and reflect on their own development.
