Important Dates

- **Friday, April 3** - Last day to withdraw from 15-week courses without penalty of WF grades by 5:00 PM
- **Wednesday, April 15** - Assessment Day - No classes

Registration for Fall 2026

Registration for the fall semester is upon us! If you have not met with your major advisor yet, contact them right away.

The system will be open for students as follows:

- **Students with 75+ credits:** Tuesday, April 14th
- **Students with 45-74 credits:** Monday, April 20th
- **Students with 0-44 credits:** Wednesday, April 22rd
- **Makeup days for registration:** Thursday, April 23th and Friday, April 24th

Please refer to the [Registrar's registration website](#) for the most current information and specific registration days and times. Registration times are based on credits earned (this does not include courses you are currently enrolled in).

Registration is in real time, which means you must sign in at the start of your registration time.

Meeting with Your Advisor

- Contact your advisor about how they would like to meet with you.
- Be prepared to discuss the courses you would like to take in the fall semester.
- Make an appointment to meet early. Waiting too long may leave you without being able to register.
- The conversation with your advisor is a collaborative session. However, you are ultimately responsible for registering for the classes you need to complete your degree.

Pathway Declaration for New Students

Students will need to declare their Pathway before this registration cycle.

- New students should declare their Pathway before they register in April.

Things to Remember About Registration



- Full-time tuition pays for 12-16 credits per semester.
- To graduate in 4 years, you need to complete a minimum of 15 credits each fall and spring semester.
- Review your DegreeWorks audit very closely before you speak with your academic advisor, and after you register.

REGISTRATION CHECKLIST



- Reviewed the pre-made **major four-year plan** in the Academic catalog
- Reviewed **DegreeWorks** audit (declared Pathway and meeting requirements)
- Looked-up classes** for the following semester
- Checked to see if future courses have **prerequisites** or major/minor **restrictions**
- Considered course **credit-load**- anything over 16-credits will be an additional cost
- Contacted primary advisor** about courses for approval and advisor hold removal
- Created **multiple course schedules** in case classes are closed (checked if courses are all online or 8-weeks or 15-weeks on ground)
- Checked **holds** in Banner Self Service multiple times leading up to registration day
- Registered** for classes once morning time slot opened

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2026 Summer Courses



Please keep the following in mind concerning upcoming summer courses.

- The 2026 summer session runs for 8 weeks, Monday, **June 8th, 2026** - Friday, **July 31st, 2026**
- Summer registration begins Tuesday, **April 14th, 2026** - Thursday, **May 14th, 2026**
- Summer registration is open every day 10:30am - 11:59pm
- Summer registration will close online on Friday, **May 15th, 2026** at 5:00pm
- Registration for summer is not based on earned hours, so all students may begin registering as early as Tuesday, **April 14th, 2026**
- Students must have all holds removed in order to register
- Students can only register for a maximum of 9 credits for the summer session
- Students wanting to take more than 9 credits must contact CAAS at advising@marist.edu from their Marist email for approval

Please be advised that all bills for summer courses must be paid in full by Wednesday, May 27th, 2026 at 5:00pm. Students with outstanding balances will be deregistered from courses on Thursday, June 4th, 2026.

Traditional undergraduate students first enrolled at Marist in Fall 2018 or later may be eligible for a summer discount of \$750 applied to the tuition charges. Please review [the details of this discount here](#).
