If you need to miss a final exam, please note that **CAAS does not send absence notifications during final exam week**. You must contact your professors directly to see if you can make up what you have missed. Additionally, we recommend you email us documentation that would support your absence.

2026 Summer Courses

Taking a summer course is great way to catch up on credits and diversify your academics!

The 2026 summer session will run for 8 weeks, starting **Monday, June 8, 2026** through **Friday, July 31, 2026**.

- Summer registration is open every day 10:30am - 11:59pm
- Summer registration will close online on **Friday, May 15, 2026** at 5:00pm
- Students can only register for a maximum of 9 credits for the summer session

Please be advised that all bills for summer courses must be paid in full by Wednesday, May 27th, 2026 at 5:00pm. Students with outstanding balances will be deregistered from courses on Thursday, June 4th, 2026.

Traditional undergraduate students first enrolled at Marist in Fall 2018 or later may be eligible for a summer discount of \$750 applied to the tuition charges. Please review [the details of this discount here](#).

Requesting an Incomplete Grade

The temporary grade of I (incomplete) may be given by an instructor when a student has not completed the requirements of the course at the end of the term for serious reasons beyond the individual's control. Supporting documentation must be submitted to the Center for Advising and Academic Services (Advising@marist.edu).

The student must contact their instructor no later than 24 hours after the scheduled time for the final examination in the course to request an I grade. The last day to resolve the incompletes for the spring 2026 is **Friday, June 26th**.

Dean's List

If you are expecting to be on the Dean's List for spring 2026, please be sure that your permanent mailing address is up to date with the Registrar's Office. Please use this [link](#) to submit the Change of Address and Telephone form. Certificates that get mailed will only be sent to the address on file.

As a reminder, in order to qualify for the Dean's List you must

- earn a semester GPA of at least 3.60
- completed 12 credits graded on the A-F scale
- must not have any grades of "I", "D", "F", or "WF"

Withdrawal From the University

Undergraduate students looking to officially exit Marist after this semester must complete the Withdrawal/Leave of Absence paperwork in my.Marist. **Do not complete this if you are graduating.** You can access the paperwork by following these steps:

1. Log on to myMarist
2. Hover over the Student tab
3. Select Advising-Undergraduate
4. Under Academic/Advising Forms, select Withdrawal Leave of Absence Form

How does the meal swipe donation program work?

How can students apply for the donated meal swipes?
