and Other Learning Experiences.

What is Title VI?

Title VI is a federal civil rights law from the Civil Rights Act of 1964 that prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, or national origin in programs or activities receiving federal financial assistance.

When Does the Policy Apply?

The Marist University Discrimination and Harassment Policy applies both on and off University property when the conduct is part of the educational program or activity. This includes internships, practicums, student teaching, service learning, and other university-sponsored learning experiences.

You are entitled to a safe and supportive educational experience wherever your learning takes place.

If You Experience Discrimination or Harassment:
