AL1: Opera as Politics

Description: This Opera as Politics series will explore how opera has reacted to racial issues and tensions in the United States from the early 20th Century to today. We will examine how opera participated in and influenced our racial narrative, and will include historical context as well as video presentations.

improvement.

AL3: The Television & Film Arena: Producers, Crew and Post. Who are they, what do they do, why so many and how much do they cost?

Description: The class will explore the positions required to make a show from Producers to Best Boys, Grips to Craft Service, VFX Supervisors and Compositors. We will explain the roles and include the fundamentals of budgeting such as "Above the Line", "Below the Line", Development costs, Residuals and Back end including an overview of International and Domestic Incentive programs available to filmmakers. Course materials will include scripts and budgets from projects along with redacted crew lists. Emerging technology will also be explored, time permitting.

Description: African American Inventors were required to sign a release relinquishing their rights of ownership and profit. These contributions to science & inventions were extensive and it's impossible to not experience the benefits of their ingenuity. Native American Code Talkers contributed to a chapter in American Military history during World War II. Without them the war may not have ended as soon as it did. African American Astronauts have participated in many space shuttle missions: performing critical tasks, deploying and retrieving satellites, performing spacewalks, conducting research and commanding and piloting space shuttle missions.

LLS1: Gentle Mind-Body Exercise for Winter

Description: Learn and practice easy movements that enliven, warm and flow, with special focus on keeping the joints open and flexible. The practices are rooted in ancient Taoism and the principles of traditional Chinese medicine. Suitable for everyone - all movements are adaptable to your comfort and ability. Practices can be done seated or standing or both. No previous knowledge is required.

Classroom & Attendance Protocols (Vírtual & In-Person)

CLS volunteers expend considerable time and energy preparing and delivering the first-rate courses that have made CLS so popular. CLS is fortunate to be located in an area with so many colleges and industries having such an abundance of talented individuals who are willing to donate their time to create and present high-quality classes for CLS. Because the CLS members, outside experts, and educators who deliver CLS classes receive no compensation or honoraria, their only reward is the interest of a courteous and appreciative audience. To optimize the class experience for the presenters, class managers, and other CLS members attending these classes, we ask that you comply with the following:

Make every effort to attend the classes for which you are registered. Good attendance is a presenter's and class manager's best reward. Each class has a Class Manager (volunteer position) who is responsible for introducing the instructor and relaying announcements for each session.

Be courteous when asking questions in class. Typically, a period of time is reserved for Q&A at the end of the lecture. The Class Manager will provide guidance on how the presenter will field questions (hand raise, chat, Q&A). Each class may handle questions differently, so please follow the set guidelines and wait until that time to ask your question. Limit your questioning, especially if the presenter accepts questions during the presentation. It is best to keep your microphone muted until it is your turn to speak or ask a question.

Show respect to presenters. All presenters are volunteers and have invested time and effort into preparing and delivering the class. Please, **DO NOT** correct or dispute what the speaker presents. Approach them after class and politely offer your thoughts as most will welcome your feedback.

Camera/Visual protocols should be followed. Remember, the presenter and other members of the class will be able to see you. If you need to engage in something other than the class, **turn off your camera** feed until you can return 100% of your attention back to the class. Your distraction can easily become someone else's distraction as they are watching you.
